"Forgiving a Brother"

Assess the situation – differences

If your brother sins

- Private in nature.
- Layered steps on how to address the sin.
- Conversation with the brother in hopes that it doesn't get any bigger.

There is immorality

among you

- Public sin that the group is aware of.
- Separation for the saving of the soul.
- The sin is affecting the attitude of the group.

Those who

caused sorrow

- The sin is in the past but the group still knows it.
- Command to reintegrate the brother.

Assess the situation - commonalities

If your brother sins

There is immorality among you

Those who caused sorrow

- We need to be hurt by sin.
- God calls for some action on our end.
- Satan is desiring the person.
- The sin causes a disruption in our relationship with the brother.
- The outcome we need to desire is the salvation of our brother.

Matthew 18:15 "If your brother sins, go and show him his fault in private; if he listens to you, you have won your brother. 16 But if he does not listen to you, take one or two more with you, so that BY THE MOUTH OF TWO OR THREE WITNESSES EVERY FACT MAY BE CONFIRMED. 17 If he refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if he refuses to listen even to the church, let him be to you as a Gentile and a tax

collector.

Contextualizing Matthew 18

- You are not better than anyone else in the Kingdom. - vv.1-4
- Your brother may fall into sin, don't be the reason they do. - vv. 5-7
- Nothing is worth losing a soul over. vv. 8-9
- God's will is that your brother is saved. vv. 10-14
- Forgiveness and restoration not shaming your brother needs to be the goal. - vv. 19-35

When dealing with sin...

Pray for your brother's soul.

Watch your own soul.

Remember God's forgiveness and judgment.

See how God has equipped you to confront the sin.

When dealing with sin...

have the compassion of Jesus.
