1Pe 5:8 Be soberminded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour.





In a second letter written by the Apostle Paul to Timothy

- Threats from within? Ungodly brethren 2:16; imposters 3:13
- **Timothy's commission?** Train teachers 2:2; Correct those that oppose the truth 2:25; Preach the Word 4:2; work of an evangelist 4:5a; fulfill **your** ministry 4:5b
- Endure hardship? Affliction? 1:8; 2:3; 3:12; 4:5
- Perilous Times? 3:1; Evil men grow worse and worse 3:13
- Abandonment?, loneliness? "those in Asia" 1:15; Demas 4:10; no one, but the Lord 4:16,17
- Failure? Stir up gift of God 1:6; Fear 1:7; Youthful lust 2:22; Disputes 2:16; 23
- Paul's imminent execution? 4:8

2Ti 3:14-17 But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work.

God's Spirit:

Rom 8:26 Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words.

God's Wisdom:

James 1:5 If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask God, who gives generously to all without reproach, and it will be given him.

God's Provisions:

Phil 4:19 And my God will supply every need of yours according to his riches in glory in Christ Jesus.

God's Presence:

Phil 4:13 I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me.

How has God empowered us to act on our Courage?

God's Faithfulness:

2Ti 2:11-13 This is a faithful saying: For if we died with Him, We shall also live with Him. If we endure, We shall also reign with Him. If we deny Him, He also will deny us. If we are faithless, He remains faithful; He cannot deny Himself.

- Dying with Him leads to living with Him.
- Enduring hardship leads to reigning with Him.
- Denying Him leads to being denied by Him.
- Being faithless is possible with us, but not with Him.
- We can fail ourselves; even others. It is impossible for God to fail!

- God's Sovereignty: we exist in a determined reality
- God's Forgiveness: possible by the blood of Christ
- God's way of escape: ethical and moral framework
- God's Spirit: uniquely aids in our inadequacies
- God's Wisdom: access to transcendent eternal truth
- God's Provisions: loss has temporal meaning
- God's Presence: interpersonal connection to God
- God's Faithfulness: the trustworthiness of God

If you will be deliberate and intentional to listen to the sacred writings that provide access to God, then you will find your Courage.

Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, that they also may obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus with eternal glory.

The entire letter is a love letter. A father to his son!

Expressions of Personal Affection

- Opening greetings, "my beloved son"
- Remembrance in prayer "day and night"
- Mindful of tears

Encouragement and Affirmation

- Timothy's genuine faith
- Stirring up the gift of God within Timothy

Instruction and Guidance

- Endure hardships "Share in my sufferings"
- Maintain emotional and ethical boundaries
- God's word is trustworthy against scrutiny
- Fulfill ministry; entrust work to others

Why is love so necessary for finding our courage?

When self-preservation is reframed into a lens of self-sacrifice, then you will find your Courage.

How does a sound mind/discipline overcome our fears?

Like David, we take a "hands down" approach.

1.Prayer:

2Ti 1:3 I thank God whom I serve, as did my ancestors, with a clear conscience, as I remember you constantly in my prayers' night and day.

2.Preparation:

2Ti 1:13 Hold fast the pattern of sound words which you have heard from me, in faith and love which are in Christ Jesus.

3. Prevention:

- 2Ti 2:16 But shun profane and idle babblings
- 2Ti 2:22 <u>Flee</u> also youthful lusts; but pursue righteousness, faith, love, peace with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart.
- 2Ti 2:23 But <u>avoid</u> foolish and ignorant disputes, knowing that they generate strife.
- 2Ti 4:2 *Preach the word!* Be ready in season and out of season. Convince, rebuke, exhort, with all longsuffering and teaching.
- 2Ti 4:5 But you be watchful in all things, endure afflictions, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry.
